Over the past summer, with archdiocesan support, we developed and implemented a plan for in-person and virtual learning to occur simultaneously for the current school year. Our task force developed guidelines and practices to ensure that all who enter the school building are as safe as possible.

After many hours of preparation, the school opened its doors on schedule! The classrooms look a trifle different–desks are required to be six feet apart, entrances have sanitizing stations, and teachers are changing classrooms instead of the students. Everyone is in a mask, but we are fortunate to be together. Deep sanitizing has become the norm, and we've hired an additional resource dedicated to the school throughout the day. The hallways are a bit quieter, and the parents' and volunteers' presence are missed, but learning still flourishes, and the students are progressing well. Our enrollment is stable, and 95% of our students are in-person, with the remaining 5% attending virtually.

The Class of 2021 has accumulated scholarships surpassing \$650,000, and we are still counting! This school year has certainly had its challenges. Covid-19 has added an unexpected dimension to our plan, though our staff, teachers, nurse, and administrators are true heroes. They have gone beyond all measures to ensure our school remains Academically Excellent and Passionately Catholic.

# Technology in Focus ·

SMM students reap the benefits of technology, especially in today's fast-paced world of unexpected challenges and change. Mrs. Pry's primary focus across every grade is integrating Google Apps and teaching internet safety, including digital citizenship. For the first time, this includes PreK-4, which uses their own school accounts, managed by the teachers. In kindergarten, students learn the basics with 'Docs and Slides.' They practice finding letters on their iPads and find further enjoyment from learning apps and websites. Students use iPads to master similar concepts in first and second grade but go more in-depth than the kindergarteners. Meanwhile, third graders are discovering how to use Google Apps on the Chrome Android devices, which are completely new to our school.

The fourth graders operate Chromebooks and learn how to collaborate on projects with their teachers and other students. Mrs. Pry finds collaboration most exciting to teach. She says, "I find the students are more independent as they learn and apply technology class lessons across all their studies." The middle school grades, including fifth grade, are chiefly concentrating on mastering Google applications and integrating them through their classwork. Mrs. Pry adds, "By the time students are in our upper middle school, they can easily craft an assignment in Docs, Slides, Sheets, and Sites either independently or collaboratively with other students."

To ensure the students remain aware and prepared, all grades get internet safety and digital citizenship lessons a few times each year. All the teachers have mastered the ability to make lessons accessible to every student, whether in-person or learning online. Our faculty is committed to preparing each student to use technology proficiently and responsibly to pursue lifelong learning— no matter their setting or circumstances. **\*** 



On behalf of the School Board, I would like to recognize and thank Monsignor Chieffo, Fr. Rice, Ms. Winterberger, each of our teachers, the staff, and administration for their commitment and dedication to our kids, parents, and community. Clearly, it has been a challenging year for each of us, but it has never been more evident to me that we are truly blessed to have our school and church community.

The Board continues to partner with Msgr. Chieffo, Ms. Winterberger, and families to support the school's long-term success. Recently, the Board completed its annual tuition assessment. This year, the average cost to educate one student at SMM is \$7,100, compared to the average tuition rate of \$4,060 per child. Since tuition only covers 66% of the cost of educating a child, the balance is met through other revenue sources. The most vital of these are gifts to our Annual School Fund and a significant contribution from our parish.

The Board has approved a tuition increase for the 2021-2022 school year consistent with prior years. This increase will reduce the school's reliance on development and the parish while providing improved financial stability. As a proud SMM alumnus and parent of two students plus a recent graduate, I personally appreciate the sacrifices each family makes to invest in Catholic education. This year, your support is needed even more; to that end, each member of our board has pledged to participate in the Annual School Fund. We hope you consider supporting this vital fund too!

Looking forward, the Board will continue to support the school across many functions, including advancement, facilities, strategic planning, and spiritual life. We continue to ask for your prayers and support. When we place our faith in God, I am confident that through His grace, our best days lie ahead.

# ELA in the Spotlight •••

In Mrs. Clark's ELA class, fourth-grade students are hard at work on critical writing styles focused on a specific genre, whether descriptive, narrative, or in this case– an expository writing piece. For this creative and interpretive task, each student is assigned a faculty or staff member to interview to offer more insight into the school's exceptional staff. Students develop five to seven 'quality questions' of interest, such as, "Why did you become a teacher?" Then, the questions are put into a logical order for their interview. Due to Covid-19, students' first task was to ask their interviewees what format they wanted to use, such as online using Zoom, email, or in-person (keeping in mind social distancing and wearing a mask).

Another classmate serves as the photographer during each interview, catching the perfect action shot or a posed photograph. Then, the real fun begins! Students must compile all their recorded information into an interesting format that is fluid with proper transitions. Only one direct quote is permitted, and they must construct a catchy headline and caption. After editing, they go to work with additional classmates on a shared Google Doc. Collectively, they decide on a newspaper title and slogan. Guided by Mrs. Pry, the technology teacher, students upload their photo selections and work with different font styles. The finished product is printed and distributed to all the faculty and visitors to the office for their enjoyment. After all their effort, the publication is a tradition enjoyed by many. **\***
